

Rural Transport Bus

The Rural Transport Bus which is operated, insured, and maintained by Local Link is an essential service which the island is very lucky to have.

The bus travels to Castletownbere on Tuesday and Thursday weekly. Tuesday it leaves the island on the 10am ferry and returns at 11:30am. Friday it leaves the island on the 10am ferry and returns at 1:30pm. On Sunday the bus brings people to and from 10am mass in Ballinakilla.

The bus can be used by everyone young and old, those with free travel can avail of it for free and everyone else pays €6 (return) along with the normal ferry costs.

An agenda was put together which included broadband, housing, piers, transport, jobs, childcare and climate change. All the issues were raised at the meeting and were well received. Comhdhail Oileáin Na hÉireann AGM

The Comhdhail AGM was held on Aranmore Island Donegal on the 2nd and 3rd of September 2022. The AGM started with a welcome from Máirtín O Méalóid Acting Chair, the Minutes of the 2021 AGM were read and adopted. The following reports were read out: Chairperson's Report, Secretary's Report, Report from Comhar na nOileán, Report from IIMRO, ESIN Report and the Auditors Report. Following this there was an Address by Minister Heather Humphreys, TD. Department of Rural and Community Development with responsibility for the Islands who spoke about the housing issue on the Islands, the lack of broadband and outlined her commitment to solving the issues to make the Islands better places to live in. After the AGM there was a conference on Island housing with the following speakers: Des Johnson Housing Planning in Ireland & the offshore islands. Cameron Anson Sustainable Communities: Addressing Depopulation in Rural and Island Scotland. Dr Elaine Desmond & Dr Conor Cashman, UCC, UCC survey work on Housing on the West Cork Islands and upcoming survey of Ireland's offshore islands.

Heritage Keepers Programme

Earlier this year Bere Island Projects Group were accepted onto the Heritage Keepers programme which is run by the Burren Beo Trust and The Heritage Council. Heritage Keepers is a programme for schools and communities which enables them to work together to explore their built, natural and cultural heritage through a 5-week online course and then initiate action plans for their area.

A group of seven from Bere Island (Eilis Duggan, Barry Hanley, Seamus Hanley, Paul Moore, Helen Riddell, Barry Sullivan and Chris Sullivan) came together to join Heritage Keepers and the group decided their action plan would be to record an oral history of Bere Island to preserve the stories and voices of the island's past for the future.

With funding from Heritage Keepers, the group were able to bring a leading oral historian, Dr Angela Maye-Banbury to Bere Island to facilitate a weekend of workshops in recording oral histories. Angela has previously recorded an oral history of Achill Island (www.achiloralstories.com)

An event was held to launch Recording Our Bere Island Stories during Heritage Week at the Bere Island Heritage Centre which received a great turnout with lots of interest and some more volunteers for the project. Separately, the Burren Beo Trust held an event in Corofin Co Clare during Heritage Week to showcase the work of all the community groups in the Heritage Keepers programme and we are delighted that Bere Island Projects Group were awarded a Heritage Keepers Special Recognition Award. To date the group have recorded a number of oral histories with more planned. It is hoped that the oral histories will be available online by early 2023 on a dedicated website. Housing

UCC made a presentation to Comhdhail on the housing study. There is a lot of good recommendations including the need for assisted housing for the elderly, restructuring of the repair & lease scheme, appointing a vacant housing officer, the development of housing associations and gateway housing programme. The plan also included the need for the County Development Plan to include the need to define a target population to zone housing for islands. The plan also states that when housing is delivered there is a need for services e.g., broadband. The official launch of the plan will be held at the end of the year. *(Submitted by BIPG)*

ESIN AGM

The ESIN AGM was held on the Island of Kihnu, Estonia and started with a Conference on “Island policies and habitability”. Island Habitability is an assessment tool for viable island communities, and it started with a workshop on Habitability indicators that make you understand your island. This was a great event, which was very practical and got a good discussion going. This was followed by the Conference “Island policies and habitability” where we had a number of speakers:

- An overview of island policies around Europe / John Walsh
- National islands policies / All ESIN members (3 min / country)
- Estonian island policy: Urve Tiidus, member of Estonian Parliament
- Irish Island policy formation: Bríd Ní Chonghaile
- The Croatian Island law and its effect on the Croatian archipelago / Professor Nenad Starch
- Scottish Islands Act and its implementation / Camille Dressler, SIF
- The future of European islands / Ivan Matic

The conference was attended by 50 people from 9 countries and 22 Islands. All the speakers gave a very good presentation of their topic and a lively question and answer session started. The ESIN AGM followed and again a good discussion was held on the role of ESIN in Europe. A new Croatian member was welcomed to the board and Ivan Matic of the Croatian Island movement thanked everyone for the welcome. The election of officers was completed, and John Walsh returned as chair, Camille Dressler and Pia Prost Vice Chairs, Rhoda Twombly Secretary and Annette Larm Johansson was treasurer. The next AGM will be held on Bere Island next September 2023.

Bere Island Treaty Port Commemoration

In 1922 one of the conditions of the signing of the Anglo Irish Treaty was that Britain would retain three deep-water ports in Ireland, at Cork Harbour, Berehaven and Lough Swilly, which became known as the Treaty Ports.

To commemorate Bere Island's role as a Treaty Port, Tom O'Neill, facilities manager and historian at Spike Island and author of *Spike Island Republican Prisoners 1921*, will give two talks at the Bere Island Heritage Centre on **Wednesday 5th October**.

2.30pm

Tom will talk on the role of the Treaty Ports, the significance of Britain retaining the ports and the final Handover of all three ports in 1938.

7.30pm

In the year leading up to the signing of the Anglo Irish Treaty, an internment camp was in operation on Bere Island, Tom will talk about the prisoners and the links between the internment camp on Bere Island and the prison camp on Spike Island.
